It's been a wonderful, busy year for the Denver & District Pipe Band. Last year, we were upgraded by the Western United States Pipe Band Association to Grade III from Grade IV. It's a big jump from IV to III. You have to learn a new set, upgrade the quality of sound, playing, and so forth. You'd think we'd be busy enough to just focus on that. But no, we decided that we needed to start a Grade IV band also!

There's good reason for it—we are a teaching band, and it is truly not a good idea to throw a newer piper or drummer into a Grade III band. They need experience in being in front of judges, figuring out how to calm nerves, and all the in's and out's of competition. Grade IV is the perfect place for that, and we had enough new people join the band that we could make that a reality. We knew it would be a challenge, but were pretty confident we could figure it out. I am happy to say that we did, and both bands were successful. But it was often exhausting, with double the

amount of work in a day for the leaders of the band. It was worth it, though. The band is stronger for it, and already looking forward to next year. We'll continue to tweak the process so that it isn't as exhausting for some people, but at least we won't be bored.

We enjoyed being in the new Snowmass location for the Colorado Scottish Festival, and were lucky enough to be the warm-up band for the Saturday night concert. Snowmass is gorgeous, and the weather was wonderful. I know that the festival will undergo some tweaking of its own—isn't that always the case—but it seems to be a good move. Especially when the other option was to discontinue the games entirely.

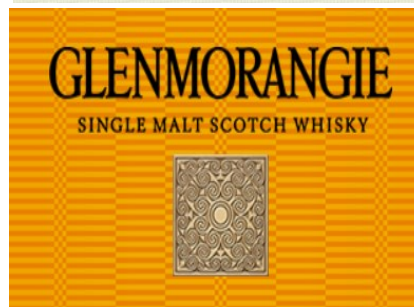

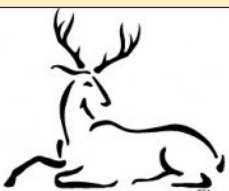
## Famous Scots



### John Stuart Mill (1806-1873)

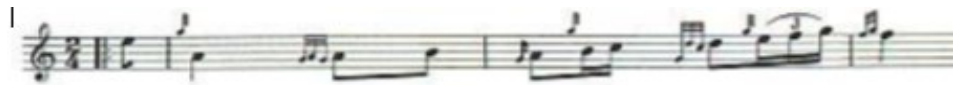
Was a philosopher, a political economist, a Member of Parliament and an important figure in liberal political philosophy. He has been called "the most influential English-speaking philosopher of the nineteenth century". Mill was a proponent of utilitarianism, arguing that one must always act so as to produce the greatest aggregate happiness among all sentient beings, within reason. His view on liberty was that each individual has the right to act as he wants, so long as these actions do not harm others. Mill also set the premises of falsification as the key component in the scientific method.

Over the years, Ruth mothered many relatives, friends, students, artists, musicians, and scholars. She was a self-defined "theatre, opera and arts junkie" and enjoyed attending the symphony, ballet, opera, and theatre.

Funeral services were held July 24 at the LDS Crestmoor Ward on 740 Hudson Street in Denver. Ruth is buried next to her husband, Harold, in the Fairmount Cemetery in Denver.
